Every student needs to be on a pathway to college and career readiness, though each pathway may be unique to that student. FHI 360's college and career readiness initiatives meet school systems, communities, community-based organizations, and employers where they are, adapt to existing strengths, structures, and culture, as well as current plans, programs, and partnerships for students, youth, and families.



Effective Strategies

We bring asset mapping, an education and career plan (ECP), work-based learning approaches, professional development for teachers, counselors, faculty, and non-profit service providers. We build robust partnerships to help students, youth, teachers, families, and employers navigate the journey from school to post-secondary and career success.

Navigators

To plan effectively for both college and careers, all young people benefit from help navigating the process. A college and career readiness navigator's essential responsibility is to guide and support youth as they: 1) explore options and plan for potential career choices and opportunities and 2) develop the knowledge, skills, and abilities to succeed in their chosen postsecondary paths. FHI 360 can help identify the right navigators—the teachers, counselors, advisors, youth workers, employers, mentors, families, parents/caregivers, and other advocates who can guide young people—and then support those navigators in effectively guiding students through the twists and turns on the road to becoming college and career ready

School Systems Approach
